Successful Grants for 2021

We have been busy applying for grants in 2020. I want to thank Lisa from the P&C for successfully securing a \$20,000 playground grant for our school. We anticipate this work to begin and be completed in 2021.

We were also successful in receiving a \$30,000 School Plus grant for a project we have called 'Learning Dispositions: Unlocking more than a year's worth of growth for a year's worth of learning'. The main drive of this project is to engage with and empower the whole community in the Visible Learning space.

Windsor HS Assessment Collaboration

Last Thursday I had the honour of collaborating with Mrs Court the Head Teacher for Maths at Windsor High School. We were working together to expand our Visible Learning Maths Assessment to include content from Year 7 & Year 8. We are finding that with so much progress happening in our classrooms that our students are needing to be not only enriched in their learning but also to be accelerated into High School content. This new component of the assessment should be finalised and ready to go for Week 4 Term 1 when we next do the assessment.
